Description of the school

Laurentian Elementary School

455 Rue Court, Lachute, QC J8H 4H6

Laurentian Elementary School is located in the heart of Lachute, Quebec, and serves a wide and diverse rural region stretching from Lac-des-Seize-Îles to Mirabel, and from Saint-André-d'Argenteuil to Harrington. LES offers inclusive and supportive learning environments from Pre-Kindergarten to Grade 6, with a focus on academic excellence, social development, and student well-being. The socio-economic index of the school remains at 9.

Student Population and Support Services

Laurentian Elementary School has 311 students. The school has a dedicated team of professionals, including 1 Special Education Technician, 3.5 Resource Teachers, 4 Attendants, 1 Daycare Technician and 2 Pre-K Educators, 4 Soutien a la classe, and 1 librarian. Additional services include a Speech and Language Pathologist, Occupational Therapist, and Psychoeducator, available one to two days per week. With a significant portion of the student body requiring regular support, LES has cultivated a warm and inclusive environment that celebrates every child's uniqueness and fosters a strong sense of community.
